

We are focused on ensuring that our planned expansion will support the sustainable growth of the Royal Docks as a social and economic hub, with a modern, vibrant dock-edge, improved public realm and new pedestrian and cycling connections.

About ExCeL London

ExCeL London’s beginnings can be traced back to 1988, when the Association of Event Organisers (AEO) first approached architect Ray Moxley to locate and design a new exhibition and conference centre within the M25. The Royal Victoria Docks site was identified in 1990 and we opened in November 2000 as one of Europe’s largest regeneration projects. In 2010 we opened our Phase 2 expansion – London’s International Convention Centre (ICC), which was designed by Grimshaw Architects, who are also leading on the Phase 3 proposals.

ExCeL London is a global leader in exhibitions, international congresses and live events. We are owned by ADNEC (Abu Dhabi National Exhibition Centre) and have now been part of the Royal Docks for over 20 years.
